

The Verb "To Have" - Syriac and Lebanese

(In Lebanese the Syriac "ܐܡܠܝܢ" contracts to "ܐܡܠܝܢ", where "ܠ" is no longer pronounced. And the suffix attached to "ܐܡܠܝܢ" also contracts, in some cases. The non-contracted form is never written out. So "He has a dog" in Lebanese "ܐܡܠܝܢ ܕܗܝܠܐ ܕܝܠܐ", is contracted to "ܐܡܠܝܢ ܕܝܠܐ".)
